June 30, 1929 - October 14, 2020

WAUSEON, Ohio – Jessie Snyder, age 91, formerly of Richmond, Indiana, died Wednesday, October 14, 2020, at Fulton Manor Nursing Home in Wauseon.

Jessie was born on June 30, 1929, in Jackson County, Kentucky, to Wiley and Jane Witt Cunagin. She moved to Richmond in 1939, where she lived until moving to Ohio to live with her son in 2015. Jessie was a 1948 graduate of Whitewater High School. She graduated from Reid Hospital's School of Nursing in 1951 and attended Earlham College in 1953. Jessie retired from Reid Hospital after 37 years, serving as both a registered nurse and Director of Nursing. She was a former member of Grace United Methodist Church in Franklin, Indiana, and Middleboro United Methodist Church in Richmond. Jessie was also a former member of the American Nurses Association and the Indiana State Nurses Association.

Survivors include her son, Mark Richard (Kristy) Snyder of Wauseon; grandson, Alexander Joseph (Morgan) Snyder of West Unity, Ohio; great-granddaughter, Nora Grace Snyder; nieces; nephews; and many friends.

She was preceded in death by her husband of 55 years, Richard H. Snyder, who died February 7, 2008; daughter, Jane Ann Snyder; parents; sisters, Letha Doan, Myrtle Bradburn, and Ada Gingry; and brothers, Russell and David Cunagin.
